TRANSCRIPT OF RECORDS	The partner universities of the Erasmus+ Programme must send the grades of our Erasmus+ students, once their mobility period is over, to the International Relations Office of the corresponding Faculty or School. The rest of the partner universities must send the grades of our exchange students (bilateral agreement) to the Central International Relations Office. https://internacional.ugr.es/en/about/contact-location?lang=en The Faculty or School of the UGR in which the exchange student is enrolled is responsible for sending the grades to the partner university. The transcript of records is digital and has official validity. NOMINATIONS APPLICATIONS	 University partners should nominate their students at least ten days prior to the online application deadline. Erasmus+ EU members states and 3rd countries associated to the programme (KA131): The official nomination of students on this programme must be completed according to the instructions given by the international relations office of the faculty or school with which your institution has signed an agreement. LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS	In general, it is established as a preferential criterion to have accredited a minimum level B1 of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages in the official language of instruction in order to be able to satisfactorily undertake undergraduate studies at the University of Granada. In any case, the Vice-Rectorate may establish the obligation to meet general or specific language proficiency accreditation requirements for certain programmes and degrees. In the case of postgraduate studies, a minimum level of B2 of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages in the language of instruction of the programme must be accredited in order to be able to enrol. The Vice-Rector's Office will provide information on the accreditation exams offered by the University of Granada remotely in order to facilitate the fulfilment of this requirement for those people with difficulties of access to examination centres, especially in the framework of development cooperation programmes.
BUDDY PROGRAMME	The main purpose of this programme is to help international students and facilitate their cultural, academic and linguistic integration in in their new country and their new host city. COST OF LIVING IN GRANADA


The city of Granada is considered to be one of the cheapest places in Spain and Europe to live, as a student. Obviously, the cost of living for each student depends on their lifestyle, but it tends to vary between €700-€800 per month. For guidance purposes, we have calculated the average cost of living in Granada in the most basic aspects:

- Accommodation in a shared flat (water and energy expenses excluded) varies roughly between €250-€300 per month.
- The daily set menu at the university canteens costs €3.50. The takeaway menu costs €6.
- A single city-bus ticket costs €1.40. If you obtain a bus card, the price is €0.87 per trip and with the University bus pass
 the cost is €0.61 per trip. A monthly pass costs about €41. (Please note that at this moment there is a reduction of 50%
 in all city-bus fares)

HEALTH INSURANCE

HEALTH INSURANCE AND ASSISTANCE: What should I do if I fall sick?

According to the UGR International Mobility Regulations, Incoming students are obliged to have health and travel insurance for the duration of their study period.

Non-urgent medical care:

To receive healthcare students must first register with the public health centre (centro de salud) nearest to their home address in Granada. Medical appointments can be requested online or by phone. The waiting time to get an appointment may vary.

Private Health System:

In order to visit your doctor, you must first call the number that appears on your insurance policy. During the call you will be asked for your identification number and your policy details. The insurance company will indicate the medical clinics where you can receive medical care in Granada.

In general, there are two hospitals or clinics in Granada that have an agreement with private insurance companies:

Urgent medical care

In line with the regulations of the National Health System, urgent medical attention is guaranteed 24/7, 365 days a year to everyone at any hospital. In the event that you should require an ambulance, you must call the **Emergency Phone Number in Spain (and all EU countries)**: 112.

PROCEDURES

Citizens from the EU, Switzerland and the European Economic Area

A valid passport or national ID card is required for entry into Spain. If you will reside in Spain for more than three months, you must register at the Central Register of Foreigner Nationals in person at the Immigration Office in Granada. You must submit a valid passport or national ID card, a copy of your health insurance card (or the insurance you have purchased) and the official UGR Erasmus student credential in order to apply. You are obliged by law to complete this registration process as soon as possible, within the first three months following your arrival.

Citizens from Non-EU countries

- Students studying at a university of an EU country (Belgium, Bulgaria, Czech Republic, Denmark, Germany, Estonia, Ireland, Greece, Spain, France, Croatia, Italy, Cyprus, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxemburg, Hungary, Malta, The Netherlands, Austria, Poland, Portugal, Rumania, Slovenia, Slovakia, Finland and Sweden). If the student has a foreigner's identity card, issued by the EU country where the student is studying, which is valid for the whole period of the mobility studies at the University of Granada, then the student should not apply for a student visa to come to Spain. The University of Granada will notify the Immigration Office in Granada of the student's arrival.
- If the student is studying at a university of a Non-EU country: the student must apply for the corresponding study visa at the Spanish consulate nearest to their home.
